
## **Dunning**

Dunning was predominately a farming area throughout much of the 19th century. It was named for Andrew Dunning, a prominent farmer and land developer who settled in the area at the close of the Civil War.

In 1868, the Cook County Infirmary and Insane Asylum (now the Chicago-Read Mental Health Center) was constructed just north of Irving Park Road, quickly becoming the community's dominant institution. To facilitate transportation to and from the county facilities, the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad constructed a spur off its main rail line. A settlement soon grew up around the train depot (built 1882; since demolished) near Irving Park and Newark. In 1889, portions of Dunning were annexed to Chicago.

Due to its longtime rural location, a number of cemeteries are located in the Dunning area. Mount Olivet Cemetery, 3826 N. Narragansett, is graced with a majestic Romanesque-style gatehouse. An adjacent cemetery, Mount Mayriv at 3616 N. Narragansett, contains the grave of Dankmar Adler, a prominent architect who designed the Auditorium Building with Louis Sullivan. Adler's monument consists of a granite-and-limestone column salvaged from his Central Music Hall (1879), which was demolished for an extension of Marshall Field & Company's State Street store in 1901.

In the decades after 1910, residential growth began to accelerate throughout the community area. Two distinctive public buildings from this period are the




An 1890 map of Dunning, showing the Cook County Infirmary and Insane Asylum (labeled "County Farm")

Amusement Hall, Read Mental Hospital 6810 W. Irving Park Rd.






O.A. Thorp Public School, 6000 W. Warwick (1916) and the Shabonna Park Fieldhouse, 6955 W. Addison (1928).

A Prairie-style theater at 6810 W. Irving Park (1915) is the best example of the Chicago-Read Mental Health Center's early structures. The Gothic Revival-style Wright Junior College, 3400 N. Austin, was the area's other major institution, following its completion in 1929.

The part of the community area west of Harlem Avenue was annexed to Chicago in 1928, and soon became the focus of increased residential development. St. Pascal Catholic Church, 6159 W. Irving Park (1930), is one of the more distinctive buildings in this area, offering a unique blend of Middle Eastern and Art Deco-style details.

Approximately half of the community area's residential structures, as well as many of the community's scattered office and industrial buildings, and a shopping area along Belmont Avenue, were built between 1940 and 1960. The largest commercial shopping district, however, is located in the adjacent village of Norridge.

The focus of the Chicago Historic Resources Survey was on buildings erected prior to 1940. Buildings and developments erected after that date generally are not included in the inventory.



Dankmar Adler Monument, Mount Mayriv Cemetery 3616 N. Narragansett Av.


